Film critic **Roger Ebert recently praised 9500 LIBERTY** warning Arizonans of the potential impact of the controversial immigration law.

Law enforcement leaders around the country have pointed to the film as an effective survey of the public safety impacts of laws like SB 1070. 9500 LIBERTY was recently presented at the Police Executives Research Forum convention in Philadelphia, PA, and at the Major County Sheriffs' Association convention in Anaheim, CA.

Harkins Theatres, which is based in Scottsdale, AZ, rushed 9500 LIBERTY into an "emergency theatrical release" when SB 1070 was signed in April. The film earned more than \$30,000 in box office, leading to theatrical engagements around the country.

9500 LIBERTY is directed by Coffee Party founders Eric Byler and Annabel Park. Byler said the film and the movement both promote "civil, fact-based, and solutions-oriented dialogue" as "the best way to approach divisive issues like immigration."
