A native Tennessean, CHARLES MARIE studied painting and drawing on an art scholarship under Professor C. Kermit Ewing at the University of Tennessee.



Mr. Marie served in the US Army from 1958-60 in Europe, where he had the opportunity for independent study of the Old Masters. He received a Bachelor of Science degree (summa cum laude) from the University of Maryland, majoring in Archaeology and Art History.

Mr. Marie began a distinguished career with the federal service in 1961, winning awards for his work as an Illustrator-Designer, magazine Art Director, and Visual Information Specialist. He began painting fulltime in 1991 at his studio in Tombstone Canyon, in Bisbee.

CHARLES MARIE specializes in representational oil and pastel paintings of the figure and southwestern landscapes. Artists who have influenced his work include Velasquez, Renoir, Waterhouse, Sorolla, Sargent, and Lucien Freud.
